The Reform Club, through its links to the London classical music scene, has established its own orchestra-in-residence – the "Orchestra at the Reform" – which is entering its third season of performances. The Orchestra plays exclusively in the Reform Club and offers the experience of orchestral concerts in a setting that is ideally suited to the chamber orchestra style.

The Orchestra delivers first class professionalstandard performances and plays under the baton of guest conductors selected by the musicians for their established prowess or growing reputation. Soloists are equally carefully chosen, often to showcase emerging talent. The standard of musicianship and quality of performance is critically acclaimed:

Klassic Begeistert

Attending a Sunday Concert at the Reform is a unique experience. It offers audiences the opportunity to visit our Clubhouse, a Grade II listed building and one of London's architectural gems designed by Sir Charles Barry, the architect of the Houses of Parliament. This setting, combined with the pleasure of uplifting music drawn mainly from the core classical, romantic and baroque repertoire (with occasional ventures into more modern pieces), makes the Sunday concerts truly magical.
